

GLCC Statement on upstream traceability of hides and skins for leather production

The GLCC believes the ability to trace hides or skins back to the abattoir, slaughterhouse, or other location where the hide or skin was removed from the deceased animal, through any number of accepted tracking methods or procedures, is sufficient to establish traceability within the leather supply chain. Accepted tracking methods include, but are not limited to, paper-based systems, physical identification systems such as stamping or barcodes, and other generally recognised tracking methods.

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
